# **Installing blinds instructions**

Installing blinds can vary depending on the type of blinds you have and whether you're mounting them inside or outside the window frame. Below are general instructions for installing typical inside-mount and outside-mount blinds. Be sure to follow the manufacturer's specific instructions that came with your blinds as well.

### **Tools and Materials:**

- Blinds
- Mounting brackets (usually included with the blinds)
- Screws
- Screwdriver or drill with appropriate bits
- Level
- Measuring tape
- Pencil
- Anchors (if necessary)

### **Inside-Mount Blinds Installation:**

## **Measuring blinds**

Properly measuring your windows is crucial to ensure that the blinds you purchase fit correctly. The measurements you need will depend on whether you are planning to install inside-mount blinds or outside-mount blinds. Here are instructions for both scenarios:

### **Inside-Mount Blinds:**

### 1. Width Measurement:

- Measure the width of the window frame at the top, middle, and bottom. Use the smallest of these measurements, as it ensures that the blinds will fit inside the window frame without rubbing against the sides.
- Measure from the inside of the window frame or where the mounting brackets will be placed.

## 2. Height Measurement:

Measure the height of the window frame from the top to the bottom. If you
prefer a precise fit, measure at multiple points and use the shortest
measurement.

## 3. Depth Measurement:

 Measure the depth of the window frame, especially if you plan to install blinds with a deeper headrail or other features. The depth will help you select the right blind style.

#### **Outside-Mount Blinds:**

#### 1. Width Measurement:

- Measure the width of the area you want to cover with the blinds. To ensure good light control and privacy, add a few extra inches (typically 2-3 inches) to the width. This will allow the blinds to overlap the window frame or molding.
- Measure the width from where the brackets will be placed.

## 2. Height Measurement:

Measure the height of the area you want to cover from the top to the bottom.
 For outside-mount blinds, you have more flexibility in the height measurement.
 You can choose to have the blinds extend above the window frame or sit below it.

## **Additional Tips:**

- Always use a metal measuring tape for accuracy.
- Round your measurements to the nearest 1/8 inch or 1/16 inch, depending on the precision required by the blind manufacturer's guidelines.
- Double-check your measurements to ensure accuracy before ordering blinds.
- If you're ordering blinds for multiple windows, measure each one separately, as window sizes can vary.
- If you are not certain about your measurements, consult with the blind manufacturer or retailer for guidance.

Keep in mind that some blinds may have slight deductions made by the manufacturer to ensure they fit properly, especially for inside-mount blinds.
